# TOWN AND GOWN SHOULD COLLABORATE FOR MEANINGFUL IMPACT

### Conference communique

At the end of the 7<sup>th</sup> Nigerian Young Academy conference held between 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2017 at the Federal University of Petroleum Resources, Effurun, a communique was issued and signed by the outgoing President, Dr Emmanuel Odjadjare. An excerpt of the communique is presented below:

### Preamble

The theme of the conference is indeed appropriate and pertinent in view of dire circumstances facing Nigeria today. Efforts to combat the prevailing economic recession have many angles to it because the problem is in itself multifaceted. Hence, the solution must not only be sought after by the government and industry, but also by all segments of the society, including the academia. As a part of the stakeholders in solving the problem of recession, the conference participants reached the following resolutions:

#### Resolutions

- NYA is accepting the challenge to assist the country to combat the prevailing economic recession through deploying its talents and resources to advance scientific researches and innovations that will redress the current local content deficiency in our country's economy.
- 2. It was noted in the foregoing that the Nigerian local content policy, for

- reasons of its restricted coverage as well as defects in the implementation mechanism, is not working as it is expected. We, therefore, posit that to produce the desired results, the local content policy must be expanded in scope to cover more sectors besides oil and gas. It must be linked to other vital areas of national life such as educational policy as it relates to science, technical and vocational training.
- 3. For the NYA's aspiration to become an effective instrument for combating economic recession therefore, its members are braced up to collaborate with other segments of the society, and if possible, constitute themselves into a pressure group, which will on a continuing basis strive to influence policy makers (legislators and the executive arm of government) as well as entrepreneurs.
- **4.** The organisation of faith-based political parties may be the way forward for Nigeria in order to proffer solutions to the current chaos in Nigeria.
- 5. We suggest measures to resolve the armed groups' proliferation, such as improved border security, aggressive public awareness, sensitization

campaigns and the enhancement of the capacities of security agencies to deal with the problem through focused training and deployment of modern technology, amongst others. However, there would be a missing link, until the weak law for dealing with such offences is reviewed.

- 6. Nigeria seems to be groping in the dark in terms of national development; hence, she continues to face serious economic challenges. It is imperative that every society must continuously return to its cherished values. For Nigeria therefore, in its effort to be rejuvenated, it is imperative that it anchors its mission on strong values and meet the basic needs of its citizens. In doing this, the political class at the moment should be in the vanguard of working to restore our jettisoned social values.
- 7. The fact therefore, remains that as long as most Nigerians remain unemployed, hungry and the education of the youths is not properly tackled, Nigeria will continue to be under the siege of insecurity. In view of this, our leaders must show true commitment to good governance which will guarantee the provision of dividends of democracy to the good people of Nigeria. This will, invariably, be a right step in stemming recession in Nigeria.
